5 seedbed ideas at home

Do you know how to make a seedbed? It is easier than you think! Keep reading because below I will explain how to make homemade seedbeds with things that you surely have at home.



Creating seedbeds is the first step to get started in the fabulous world of plants and home gardens. To get started, you will only need seeds, good quality soil or substrate, containers and patience. Although you can buy the seedlings in specialized plant stores, it is best to make them with things you have at home, especially since the seedlings will only be used for a short time and only once.

Take note and start your home garden with the following 5 ideas for homemade seedlings

1. Seedbed in disposable cups or containers



Do not throw away the plastic containers of yogurt, cream, sauces, cheese or disposable cups, turn them into seedbeds! To do so, you only need to wash them very well and make a small hole in the base so that when it comes to watering your seeds the water does not stagnate at the bottom of the glass.

2. Seedlings in toilet paper tubes



Toilet paper tubes have many uses, in addition to using them to make countless crafts, you can turn them into seedbeds. All you need is to fold one end in, turning it into a small container. Add soil or substrate, sow your seeds and voila! Easier, impossible.

3. Eggshells



The next time you prepare your favorite egg recipes, don't throw away the shells, save them and when you have enough, use them to create your homemade seedbeds. Remember that before sowing in them you have to wash them very well and boil them to remove any trace of egg, then with a needle or a screwdriver make a small hole in the base so that the water does not stagnate when watering your seeds.

4. Egg Cartons



Egg cartons work perfectly as homemade seedbeds since the carton allows water to circulate very well and they will also stay moist for longer, creating the perfect home for your seeds to germinate as well as possible.

5. Milk or juice containers

Milk or juice containers can also become the perfect home seedlings, you just need to cut them in half, make a hole in the base and that's it! Don't forget to wash them very well before sowing the seeds.

Now yes, with all these ideas you have enough inspiration to create your homemade seedbeds.

Remember to choose seeds that germinate easily, you can start with cherry tomatoes, carrots, onions, lettuce and even chia.

Once you have finished sowing your seeds, clean the work area with a damp cloth and a few drops of Fabuloso, you will see that everything is clean and smelling delicious.
